Flag Raising

It was a historic moment in Continental Ranch on Saturday December 10th! CRCA was honored to have troops join forces from the local boy scouts & girl scouts for the flag raising ceremony at the CRCA Community Center.



The Board approved the purchase and installation of a flagpole at the CRCA Community Center, and an U.S. American flag was ordered. The

flag which had been flown over the U.S. capitol arrived from Washington D.C. in late November. The local scout troops coordinated to find a time when they could come do the honors and raise the flag for CRCA.

The Board had carefully selected a flag pole which has downward illumination so that the flag does not need to be raised up and taken down each day, and an enclosed chain for long term durability.

Prior to the installation of speed humps on Palm Brook Drive, the Town will require community approval in the form of a signed petition and a letter of support from the CRCA Board of Directors.

December Recap: Meeting At A Glance

The following are highlights from the regular meeting of the Board of Directors held 15 December 2011 at the Community Center. Completed minutes are posted to the web site in draft format and will be approved at the next appropriate meeting. A copy may also be requested from the office staff

President's Report

Mr. Lambert shared a letter received from a resident indicating concerns for the environment by encouraging a holiday lighting decorating contest throughout the community, and requesting a cancellation of such events.

Homeowner Forum

The resident who identified an RV being used in the residential area as an office at the last meeting indicated no change in status. The Board advised action had been taken. A recycle bin infraction was also noted, and the resident requested the drive-by inspector investigate.

Recent Correspondence

A resident requested approval to plant trees outside his property wall and maintain them. Authorization given with adherence to the approved published guidelines and instructions outlined by Management. The Tiger Club Den was given permission to use the Community Center twice monthly for den meetings pending receipt of insurance coverage and membership roster approval.

Board Actions

Members for the Activities Committee are still being sought. Approval given for preparation and painting of the kiddie pool shade structure poles, installation of a digital timer to disconnect power to the spa tub during non-use hours, and installation of 36 tons of river rock in the basin floor at the end of Windmill Field. A variance request postponed from a previous meeting was again postponed pending additional information. The November Finance Report was accepted. Proposal to repair and drill out weep holes in the wall surrounding the Center pool, along with painting the entire Community Center complex was approved. An ad hoc committee was appointed to recommend paint colors for consideration. Restriping the parking lot will be discussed with the Town of Marana. Painting of wrought iron along Acacia Trail was postponed until area residents are apprised of options. Installation of a water line from the existing water supply to the new refrigerator was approved for the Management office kitchen.

Approximately 75 folding chairs, currently in storage, are being offered to the community at \$2.00 each. Four office computers, with hard-drives wiped are to be donated to World Care. A barbeque, prepared on location by the DLC staff, will be the entrée at the upcoming Volunteers Appreciation Luncheon at the Center in mid-January.

A settlement offer was made to Sunflower Community Association regarding the on-going water meter issue along Twin Peaks. In the same area, from Coachline to Safeway, the Town of Marana is considering a grant for a bike path. Meetings with Town of Marana personnel are ongoing.

Manager's Report

Status of late fees postings for November was discussed, the annual audit is being coordinated with completion anticipated early in 2012. There was a problem with pool under-water lighting, which has been resolved. Preparations are being made for the Volunteer Worker's Luncheon. Staff continues to work with committees and provide assistance wherever needed.

PROPER SHRUB PRUNING

The Growing Season

During the summer growing season, shrubs are lush, healthy and blooming. When cool fall and winter temperatures set in, our desert shrubs slow their growth dramatically. During roughly November through April, the shrubs on our properties are seasonally pruned to reduce their size before the next year's growing season. Some landscape management providers choose to shear shrubs into shapes such as: cones, balls, flat tops and beer kegs, throughout the growing season. The advantage to the landscape provider is that employees need little training, knowledge or supervision to simply shear every plant on the property each time they are in an area. This practice is detrimental to the health of the plant as the plant requires more water to recover the lost foliage.



Seasonal pruning stimulates natural growth and produces more blooms

Proper Pruning

DLC Resources, Inc.'s approach is different. Our Seasonal Shrub Renovation Program consists of trimming shrubs back to roughly half their size. On some species, like the Red Bird of Paradise, even more

pruning is needed. This type of pruning permits plants to grow back into their space during the following growing season. Shrub renovation allows residents to enjoy the seasonal color of common area plants because they are not being trimmed during their flowering season. Shrubs that encroach on streets or sidewalks, or obstruct lines of sight at intersections and near road signs, are pruned as necessary to ensure safety.



This healthy Sage reached its peak size at the end of the growing season.

After Seasonal Prune



Shrub renovation cuts plants, like this Sage, back to roughly half their peak size.

Natural Growth



This Sage was renovated in the fall. It is growing naturally in its allotted space.



Constant shearing throughout the growing season results in declining health and fewer blooms.


