President's Report -John Lambert

I hope that you have been able to visit Windmill Park since the brickwork has been completed. It has made the picnic areas a lot more inviting and accessible to everyone now that the walkway is complete. The BOD approved redoing the grass surrounding the picnic area as there were high and low spots after the brick work was completed and it will level out the high and low spots. A number of BOD members have looked at the condition of the concrete pads in the picnic area as well as the picnic tables and have management getting bids improving those items.

There have been remarks heard within the community about there being too much money being spent on landscaping of the common areas (Windmill Park, entry ways, Twin Peaks, etc.). I would first like to thank our landscape committee for working hard to present much needed improvements to the BOD and spending time actually touring the community to come up with their proposals. The governing documents require: "The Association shall use a reasonably high standard of care in providing for the repair, management and maintenance of the Common Areas..." The current budget for landscape is the same as it was before the current BOD was elected in 2008 and has not required an increase because of the hard work of the landscape committee, the BOD and management.

The ballots for the election of the BOD should have been received by you now and I urge you all to voice your choices for the direction CRCA

takes. You have probably noticed that the process has changed a little. We were informed by our attorney that the State of Arizona now requires that all ballots cast can be identified to the person casting the ballot. You used to have to sign the envelope and your ballot was put inside with no way to identify who voted. With the new requirement the BOD decided to require the signature on the ballot but we also have hired a CPA firm to handle all counting of the ballots received by them. No one within CRCA will ever see who voted for whom under this arrangement. The ballots once counted will be sealed and held by the CPA- only to be released to the court if an election result is challenged. Please vote your choice.

September Recap: Meeting At A Glance

The following are highlights from the regular meeting of the Board of Directors held 20 September 2012 at the Community Center. Completed minutes are posted to the web site in draft format and will be approved at the next appropriate meeting. A copy may also be requested from the office staff and/or a full recording of this or any committee meeting.

Homeowner Forum

An issue of possible damage to the Community Center's kitchen microwave is to be resolved by management investigation. Several comments of appreciation for actions throughout the community were noted. Mrs. Sandy Padilla, a candidate for the upcoming election, resigned her positions on Activities and Finance Committees and is hopeful to work with a new Board.

Recent Correspondence

Appreciation for monument landscaping at a subdivision entranceway was shared. Mr. Dave Cobble, Sunflower Community Association, followed up on a letter received from Northwest Fire District regarding "Help" door hangers to be distributed to residents in the event of a community major disaster. Residents of C.R. may look for information in an upcoming Windmill. One RV parking variance was approved. Two parking variance requests were disapproved; two returned to Covenants for recommendation. Fine was waived on a Windmill pool smoking incident with dispute between resident and pool monitor.

Board Actions

DLC authorized to treat 148 agaves throughout the community with pesticide, fertilize eight queen palm trees in three seasonal applications, install 89 five-gallon replacement plants, install 18 15-gallon Little Johns at Coachline and Silverbell monuments, install two BBQ grills and replace 4,400 sq ft. of turf in Windmill Park.

Four properties will receive routine lot clean-ups with fine and pool key suspension if not cleared in authorized time period. Committee minutes were received, and Finance Committee's August 2012 Reports were approved. Chairs in the Community Center will be cleaned and treated. Perry Heating and Cooling will install two vents to improve ventilation of the HVAC

system, and install locking thermostat covers in the Community Center. Ramada lights at the Windmill pool will be repaired. Monument sign light cages throughout the community to be repainted, and vandalized solar battery boxes repaired/replaced. Solar batteries and controllers with new locks at various locations will be replaced. Signage will be repainted at the Richmond Estates Monument sign and "CR" logo added. There will be no fees charged for the annual fall community yard sale event. Waste Management has been acknowledged as the preferred trash provider within the community for the coming fiscal year.


Elections/Annual Meeting

Date of record—20 September 2012. Annual meeting scheduled for 30 October, 7 p.m. in Twin Peaks Elementary School. Nine candidates on ballot. Bios will be included in the election packet to be mailed to residents. Meet the Candidate event is scheduled for 2 October 2012, 7 p.m. at the Community Center. The president appointed an Election Committee—Bill Cicala, Dave Lawrence, Illa Krasnick, John Abraham, Randall Brookshier.

Manager's Report

Mr. Seng reported a temporary web site problem. Election materials are being reproduced and prepared for mailing. The Mother-Daughter tea sponsored by the Activities Committee was well received and most successful. Vandalism with monument lighting in seven locations reported to police. Project at the Windmill Park is nearing completion with installation of pavers, railings, soil stabilization, erosion control, etc. BBQ grills to be installed as soon as received. Lighting issues at pools and several landscape issues are being handled. Pool lighting issues being corrected; pool monitors working a 2-hour shift to secure pool areas each evening. Pool key system is being upgraded. Winter hours for pools: 5:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. 107 homeowners show payment delinquencies.

The third year anniversary of Home Management Solutions as C.R.'s management team was acknowledged with thanks from the staff for respect and support.

Warding Off the Pests



Landscape Committee wishes to help the community by making readers aware of ways to save their plants and shrubs from pest attacks. Some shrubs tend to be less susceptible than others to pest damage, but pest activity has seemed to be more apparent last year – and even worse this year due to the higher than average rainfall. Some plants, such as

the Texas Mountain Laurel have been notorious for pest attack, but last year the Landscape Committee began noticing shrubs such as the Tecoma Stans (Yellow Bells & Orange Jubilee) were getting mowed down by insect damage. The tiny caterpillars feed on the foliage and can quickly decimate their host plant. CRCA has had decent success by using a systemic pesticide application in the late spring, with a follow up treatment mid-summer. The name of the game is to be proactive and treat plants in advance before the insects arrive to feast. This year there were additional plants affected, such as bougainvillea and even the desert spoon yucca plants. CRCA has begun a pesticide treatment for all agave plants as well, since those have been very susceptible to attack by weevils. Local nurseries are a great resource for gathering advice on which pesticides work best for the various applications.

Update - Trash Service Provider

The trash provider saga comes to a close! The Board of Directors wishes to thank everyone who attended the June 23rd forum at Twin

Peaks Elementary. At their September meeting, the Board of Directors approved awarding the title of Preferred Provider to Waste Management. The 5-year exclusive contract with Waste Management ends October



31st, at which point Waste Management will become the Preferred Provider. Beginning on November 1st, residents of Continental Ranch will be free to select any provider of their choice. As Preferred Provider, Waste Management will compete to earn their customers' business with a slight reduction in rate and by continuing to offer such services to its customers that the community has come to know, such as the seasonal Large Item Pickups.

Continental Ranch is such a beautiful community, and one thing that many residents take pride in is the exterior finish of their homes – which is clear, judging by the abundant number of applications for exterior painting that we process at the Architectural Review Committee meetings.



As a friendly warning to readers of the newsletter, the Architectural Review Committee (ARC) wants residents to be aware that in the past few weeks we have come across an incident where an unsuspecting homeowner was duped by a painting contractor into believing that the colors the homeowner had chosen for their home were already approved by the Association. Unfortunately, the colors had not been approved and were ultimately found to be unacceptable.

If this situation is presented to you by a contractor, advise them that all paint colors must go through the CRCA office. No painting contractor has anything to say about what is approved or not approved. Homeowners must make application personally at the office. The management staff at the office do their best to help make the application process as simple and easy as possible, all you have to do is ask!

CRCA has dozens of preapproved color combinations which can be authorized by management on-the-spot; if selected at the office you can walk out the door ready to start your project. If you would like to select a custom color, that is allowable also, but needs to be reviewed and approved by the Committee prior to starting the project. The ARC meets twice a month so that projects can be approved for you as quickly as possible.

JAVELINA IN YOUR LANDSCAPE

Javelina, which resemble wild pigs, are actually peccary. These "desert hogs" have become quite common in certain residential areas, particularly where they find food. Preferred javelina diet consists of succulent plants and cacti, flowers, and other lush vegetation. Your beautiful bed of flowers is a delicious salad bar to a javelina.

Good news! There are certain plants that don't taste good to a javelina. For a list of these plants, please check out the Arizona Cooperative Extension website below. Be aware, most new plants are an open invitation for consumption. So it's best to install plants that are at least 5-gallons in size.

Largely nocturnal creatures, javelina can also be seen in the daytime during wintertime when the nighttime temperatures are colder. To discourage javelina from taking up residence in your neighborhood, follow these simple tips:

- Avoid installing tasty plants, or plants that drop fruit/nuts
- Ensure there are no pools of standing water to drink
- Keep garbage and table scraps secured and off the ground
- Eliminate habitat such as crawlspaces or other areas for a javelina to hide
- Do not scatter birdseed.
 Rather, try using seed
 blocks that can be
 suspended and do not
 contain much litter.

While there is no proven method for completely eliminating javelina, these suggestions will encourage javelina to frequent places other than your yard, while allowing you to enjoy an aesthetically pleasing desert landscape.


