The following are highlights from the regular meeting of the Board of Directors held October 17, 2013 at the Community Center. A representative from the Davis-Monthan Advocacy Group gave a short presentation about the Air Force Base and the mission of his advocacy group to promote Davis-Monthan AFB.

Board Actions

Additional plant replacements were approved as recommended by the Landscape Committee. Several Covenants Committee recommendations approved: \$25 fines for various unresolved violations. Proposal from Pattison-Evanoff Engineering approved for basin analysis. Contract with J. Todd Lundering CPA for the association's annual financial audit approved.

HOA Management Solutions contract renewed.
Town of Marana graffiti abatement pilot program approved.

Actions in Lieu

Action in lieu ratified: Approval of meeting for the Ad Hoc Committee for Windmill Park Play Structure Replacement on 14 October 2014.

Mr. Seng reported on status of all projects recently completed and/or currently underway, including: the preparations made for the upcoming annual meeting, CRCA website upgrades, refinishing of parcel monument signs, refurbishment of Windmill Park monument sign, installation of additional light pole at Community Center; monthly Block Party events well attended. Association Dues Reminder

It's that time again... the semi-annual CRCA assessments are due November 1st. As usual, there is a 15-day grace period before late fees are applied. As advertised in previous newsletters, if you wish to begin monthly pre-payments (instead of semi-annual lump payments) now is an ideal time to begin. Monthly payments are less than \$25 per month and many residents find this to be much more manageable than paying the full assessments twice per year. Vandalism at Windmill Pool

The upgraded lighting and security cameras at the pools have proved to be a very effective deterrent, and things have been very calm at the CRCA facilities for quite some time. Unfortunately after a vandalism-free year-and-a-half streak at the pools, an incident occurred in mid-October. During the wee hours of October 13th, a group of four young adults were hanging around outside the management office when one of them threw a glass liquor bottle over the fence which flew approximately sixty feet before smashing on the deck and spraying glass shards into the pool. The pool had to be closed for extensive cleaning. If you have any information about the suspected identity of the person in this photo, please call the management office at 520-297-7600. 

Restored & Revamped - Windmill Monument Refurbishment

It's a redundant theme, but another reserve study project is now completed -- a job well done. The reserve study identified the aged Windmill Park monument sign as due for refurbishment this year, so the project research began earlier in the year and took many months to come to fruition. The new monument included replacement of the metal sign with new styling designed match others throughout the community; solar power LED illumination for better visibility in the evenings; and refurbished landscape for improved foot traffic durability and better consistency with the other main monuments in Continental Ranch. The Landscape Committee assisted with their portion of the project in late spring to get the turf installed before the summer heat was in effect to allow it to become well established. Installation of the accent plants were postponed until construction work for the sign was complete in order to avoid damaging the new plantings. Because Windmill Park is a centerpiece for the Community, the Board felt that this refurbishment was very important. It's likely that many residents today wouldn't be able to describe from memory what the old sign looked like, since it was not eye catching and somewhat difficult to see; a contrast to the brilliant new showpiece for Windmill Park and CRCA.



It's All About Community

Most able-bodied folks probably take for granted the blessing of mobility, but for some who rely on assistance of a wheelchair or walker there are many



challenges and obstacles intertwined with

the navigation of everyday life. One such obstacle was brought to the attention of the CRCA Landscape Committee regarding the lack of a pathway connecting the Windmill Park west parking lot to the field. In response to requests and concerns from within the community, the Landscape Committee began discussing and planning this project

several months ago. With generous donations from Titan Landscape, the help of the Boy Scouts Troop #219, as well as numerous volunteer residents from

Continental Ranch, the volunteer project at the park finally came together early last month; and the results were outstanding.



Titan Landscape launched the project a few days in advance, by knocking out some of the more technical and time consuming aspects of the project.

On the morning of Saturday October 5th the volunteers got right to work. First the adults set the course and help guide the Scouts until they quickly got the hang of it. Everyone

agreed the Boy Scouts did a phenomenal job and were a tremendous asset to the operation. Once the final brick was in place, the group enjoyed a tasty barbecue lunch prepared by Titan Landscape on their mobile grill. It was a job well done!

2013 CRCA Adopt-A-Family

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WEED MANAGEMENT

Weeds can be a homeowner's worst nightmare, conjuring thoughts of back-breaking hours digging and pulling, or compliance notices if they aren't removed. **You can avoid both of these headaches** very easily this season. Continental Ranch Community Association once again offers the semi-annual program for your common area landscape maintenance contractor, Titan Landscape, to spray pre-emergent herbicide in your front yard to **prevent most weeds** before they have a chance to become a problem.



- **If no rain occurs within two weeks after the spray is applied, please water in the pre-emergent using a garden hose.**

- Application of pre-emergent can greatly reduce the number of weeds that germinate.

- Pre-emergent herbicides are designed to prevent seeds from germinating in the soil - **existing weeds should be removed** prior to pre-emergent application.

- Pre-emergent herbicide does not affect living plant material such as trees and shrubs so the rest of your landscape will not be harmed in the process.



WANT TO KEEP THE WEEDS OUT OF YOUR YARD?

Titan Landscape will be offering pre-emergent preventative weed spraying for Continental Ranch homeowners at a rate of \$47.00 per front yard. Spraying will take place December 2nd through December 6th, 2013. If you would like to take advantage of this service, please visit the Windmill Park management office and return this form with a check made payable to CRCA by November 22, 2013.

This 'N That

November has so many significant days to remember. In addition to Thanksgiving, it's also National Hospice Month, as we honor the corps of professionals and spiritual support to the terminally ill and their families. There's Election Day, Remembrance Day—celebrated by our Canadian friends; the US Marine Corps' anniversary; Veterans' Day honoring all military personnel with special activities scheduled throughout Tucson and across the nation; and Hanukkah which occurs on Thanksgiving Day—the first time since 1888! November also means whale-watching season off the coast of California, so if you are traveling that direction this month, plan on enjoying this annual observance.

We also note the end of daylight savings time.

Veterans' Day was originally called Armistice Day, announcing the end of WWI. Formal ceremonies are annually held in Europe. The Belgium Tyne Cot Cemetery is the largest British war cemetery in the world with nearly 12,000 graves registered. The British government employs locals to tend to the headstones in 137 cemeteries around the city, the final resting place for some 150,000 soldiers. Nearby German graveyards hold another 127,000. It is estimated that nearly 10 million died in the "Great War," including many millions dead from the ongoing flu epidemic of that time.

Thanksgiving Day appears to be the real beginning of the upcoming American holiday season. Families gather to celebrate with turkey and all the fixin's as a way to honor the four wild turkeys reportedly served during the first Thanksgiving feast. Since that very first gathering of settlers and newly-befriended Native Americans, the turkey has become the most well-known symbol of Thanksgiving. It is said that Benjamin Franklin was in favor of making the turkey the American national bird over the bald eagle, since it is a native bird of the continent. 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
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
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2013 Continental Ranch Market Share



2013 Dove Mountain Market Share




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

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
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
