Maintaining Community Assets

The neighborhood park in the River's Edge parcel recently received an exciting new edition. After nearly two decades of use, the park's old play structure was finally retired from service. The old structure had originally been installed back when the neighborhood was built and it saw plenty of years of good use. In its place now stands a new shiny play structure which neighborhood kids are enjoying greatly, according to residents of River's Edge.

The decision to replace the play structure was based on the Association's reserve study. For those who read the



Windmill Newsletter each month, you're probably already familiar with the reserve study. For those who might not know what a reserve study is, it is a comprehensive report which catalogs all major assets owned by the Association and identifies estimated life spans for each component. The Continental Ranch Board of Directors uses this reserve study as a tool to properly budget for major expenses that are anticipated over the next several decades.



The old play structure was listed as "expired" in the reserve study, which prompted the Board to begin reviewing whether the structure needed to be replaced. The Board first ordered a certified inspection be performed to assess the condition of the old structure. The results of that inspection showed numerous repairs were necessary; the cost to repair the structure's worn out components was roughly half the cost of purchasing a new structure. The Board, after careful consideration, decided to use the allocated funds from the budget to order a full replacement, as recommended by the reserve study.

The Board of Directors hopes that residents are pleased with the new play structure and that it gets a lot of use. One of the best aspects of the new structure is that it came with a built-in shade structure. Given our blazing hot summer temperatures, this shade should help keep the structure cool and make it welcoming to play activities by neighborhood children.

CRCA Annual Elections

There are four Directors on the CRCA Board of Directors who will be elected at the Annual Meeting on October 20, 2015. The positions coming



open are currently held by Peggy Bracken, Bill Dawes, Marilyn Stimpson and Nicholas Westphal. The CRCA Bylaws guide the steps and timeline for the election.

Anyone wishing to run for the Board in this year's election needs to fill out the Application for Candidacy form and turn it the office no later than June 19th. Continental Ranch is a strong and vibrant community. Its success depends on the volunteers willing to donate their time to serving on the Board of Directors. Continental Ranch Swimming Pool Rules

Accounts past due will have their pool key card turned off until payment is received.

- 1. Association rules, regulations, and all posted signs must be followed. Lifeguards are not on duty. Swim at your own risk.
- 2. You must conduct yourselves safely and in a manner that does not interfere with the enjoyment of the pool and spa by all participants.
- 3. Pool Staff and others designated by the Board of the Directors have the authority to enforce these rules, and not allow entry to those not willing to abide by them.
- 4. The Windmill Park and Community Center swimming pools are only for the use of residents and their guests. Residents must accompany their guests at all times. Limit of 5 guests per card holder. For larger groups, permission must be received from the Continental Ranch Administrative Office. Authorized staff has the right to limit the number of guests using the facility on any day. Maximum occupancy in swimming pool area is 120 people. No more than 90 people can be in the water at any time.
- 5. Children under 12 years old must be attended by an adult over the age of 18 at all times.
- 6. Children under the age of 15 are not allowed in the spa under any circumstances.
- 7. Proper swim suit attire is required in the pool. No cutoffs or street clothing allowed.
- 8. Do not prop open the gates to the pool or restrooms.
- 9. You must shower prior to entering the pool or spa. Use of soaps and/or shampoos is prohibited.
- 10. Please remember to only walk on the deck. No diving. No running or horseplay permitted on the deck or in the pool. Only use appropriate "pool toys" and flotation devices in pool area.
- 11. Do not enter the pool if you have an infectious or contagious disease, open cuts, sores or bandages.
- 12. Children in diapers must wear secure fitting waterproof pants over the diapers.
- 13. No defecating, urinating, spitting, or placing other foreign substances in the pool. Do not swim if you are incontinent or suffering from diarrhea.
- 14. No glass containers permitted in the pool area.
- 15. No food, drinks, drugs, or tobacco are allowed inside the pool area, except for water.
- 16. No pets of any kind permitted in the pool area, except for working "Service Dogs".
- 17. Please deposit all trash in the containers provided.
- 18. Abusive behavior and vandalism is prohibited: No climbing on walls and gates. No fighting. No use of the pool outside of posted pool hours or during inclement weather.
- 19. Bicycles, skateboards, roller skates, roller blades and riding toys must be parked outside the pool area.
- 20. Only use battery operated audio equipment with earphones.
- 21. If using suntan lotion, place a towel over the chair to protect it from oil damage.
- 22. Scuba equipment is not allowed except during class instruction approved by the Board of Directors.
- 23. Keep clear of swimming lanes when used by lap swimmers. Do not hang on or play with lane lines.
- 24. Do not interfere with emergency procedures, accidents or drill exercises, including handling of pool equipment.
- 25. Continental Ranch Community Association and staff is not responsible for valuables left in the pool area.
- 26. Only one card issued per household. Replacement fee charged for lost cards: 1st time \$10, 2nd time \$15, 3rd time, and thereafter \$20.
- 27. Violation of any pool rule(s) will result in a 30-day suspension of pool privileges and a \$25 fine.

Continental Ranch Community Association once again offers the semi-annual service for your common area landscape maintenance contractor, Titan Landscape, to spray pre-emergent herbicide in your front yard to prevent most weeds before they have a chance to become a problem. This offer is excusive for Continental Ranch residents only.





- If no rain occurs within two weeks after the spray is applied, please water in the pre-emergent using a garden hose.
- Application of pre-emergent can greatly reduce the number of weeds that germinate.
- Pre-emergent herbicides are designed to prevent seeds from germinating in the soil - **existing weeds should be removed** prior to pre-emergent application
- Pre-emergent herbicide does not affect living plant material such as trees and shrubs so the rest of your landscape will not be harmed in the process.

Titan Landscape will be offering pre-emergent preventative weed spraying for Continental Ranch homeowners at a rate of \$47.00 per front yard.

Spraying will take place June 15th through June 19th, 2015.

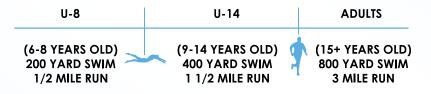

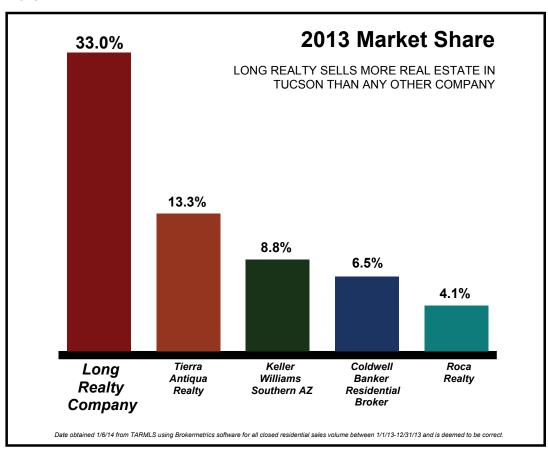

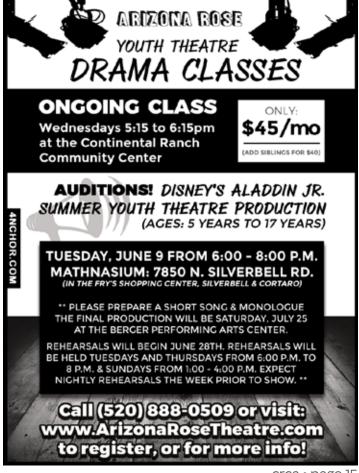

Management's Message

I hope everyone keeps the monthly food truck block parties in mind so you can come enjoy the variety of food and mingle with members of the community! Temperatures have been great for an evening at the park. We'd like to apologize if anyone was disappointed at last month's event. We had several trucks cancel at the last minute for various personal emergencies, which overloaded the trucks who attended and created a few unhappy (not to mention hungry) people. We try our best to get commitments from the food trucks, but they're still individually owned and sometimes "life happens" and they simply can't make it; typically we don't have so many that cancel at once. We expect a full line up at this month's roundup – we hope you can make it! (Monday June 8th from 5pm -8pm at Windmill Park)

I've mentioned this is previous newsletters, but it's still worth saying again: thank you to everyone who calls in common area irrigation leaks. Last month I had 5 different residents call our emergency line on the weekends to let us know about irrigation leaks, which helped us get a jump on dispatching the landscape contractor to make necessary repairs. Continental Ranch is so large and contains so many common areas that leaks are inevitable; what counts is how quickly we can get them under control. Many people simply drive by the leaks and figure that someone else will take care of them, so we appreciate everyone who took time out of their day to phone in the irrigation leaks.

We also appreciate when folks let us know about bushes that cause traffic visibility issues. We do our very best to drive the community frequently and inspect for bushes and trees that are making it hard to see when pulling out of one street onto another. Yet, despite our best efforts, from time to time there are occasions when we may not spot an issue. We always appreciate when we get calls from residents letting us know when certain areas need attention.

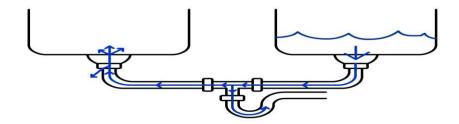
