Coachline Blvd. Updates

Our Town of Marana is pleased to announce they are gearing up for major updates to Coachline Boulevard. The final scheduling details are not completely ironed out yet; however, the tentative plans are for the repaving of Coachline to begin before the end of this year. The current plan is to begin asphalt work at Silverbell Road and Coachline, working their way towards Twin Peaks Road. Work will then continue up Coachline north of Twin Peaks Road, repaving the roadway all the way north to the point where Coachline reconnects to Silverbell.

As always, the Town takes great care in minimizing impact to the daily travels of its citizens, however, we know that with any paving project, there will be inevitable delays during certain stages of construction. The Town is holding a public outreach meeting at the CRCA Community Center on Friday November 9th at 5:30pm. Residents are highly encouraged to attend as this will be an opportunity to get more details about the schedule and scope of the project, as well as to present questions to Town staff involved with orchestrating the project.

2018 CRCA Adopt-a-Family





WEED MANAGEMENT

Weeds can be a homeowner's worst nightmare, conjuring thoughts of back-breaking hours digging and pulling, or compliance notices if they aren't removed. You can avoid both of these headaches very easily this season. Continental Ranch Community Association once again offers the semi-annual program for your common area landscape maintenance contractor, Environment Control, to spray pre-emergent herbicide in your front yard to prevent most weeds before they have a chance to become a problem.





- If no rain occurs within two weeks after the spray is applied, please water in the pre-emergent using a garden hose.
- Application of pre-emergent can greatly reduce the number of weeds that germinate.
- Pre-emergent herbicides are designed to prevent seeds from germinating in the soil **existing weeds should be removed** prior to pre-emergent application
- Pre-emergent herbicide does not affect living plant material such as trees and shrubs so the rest of your landscape will not be harmed in the process.

AAA Landscape will be offering pre-emergent preventative weed spraying for Continental Ranch homeowners at a rate of **\$40.00** per <u>front yard</u>. Spraying will take place <u>December 3rd – 12th.</u>

Common Areas Update

What's going on with those weeds in the common areas? In recent weeks, the CRCA management office has fielded a number of concerns made by residents who have expressed their dissatisfaction with the amount of weeds in some of the common areas throughout the community. Admittedly, these residents' concerns were not without merit.

The CRCA Board of Directors, as well as the association's management staff, are committed to holding common area conditions to the highest standards. Despite all the best efforts made in contractor selection and management of contractor performance, the association was let down by yet another landscape maintenance contractor earlier this year.

The board did not waste any time replacing the underperforming contractor, however, there were some issues that carried over from one contractor to the next, as the new contractor worked aggressively to get the property caught



up. Given the size of the community common areas, this "catch up" process was quite an undertaking.

When common area conditions slip below the standards required by the board, the board understands the frustration it causes residents. CRCA strives to avoid "double standards" at all costs, and the board recognizes the issue which arises when residents are sent violation notices for weeds in their yard, yet they see weeds growing in the common areas.

CRCA welcomes AAA Landscaping as its new common area landscape maintenance contractor. AAA Landscaping has assured the association that their supervisors and crews understand the challenges faced here in the past and has committed to ensuring that things are handled properly in order meet the high standards expected by the board and all members of the community.

Home Maintenance

Over the past year, readers of this newsletter have probably noticed several mentions about a growing number of homes throughout the community which are showing signs of wear and which need to be painted. The time has now come, and in October the CRCA management staff conducted a thorough inspection of all



homes in Continental Ranch to evaluate which ones are in need of maintenance. The first batch of letters should have been mailed by the time this newsletter reaches doorsteps (or shortly thereafter).

The CRCA Board of Directors understands that home maintenance (especially painting) can be somewhat costly, and with the holidays coming up, this first notification will gently give homeowners several months to complete the work. The board hopes that folks will take advantage of their tax returns in early 2019 to perform the much needed maintenance work done on their homes. When it comes to home maintenance, it's often times an awkward conversation for the

HOA to have with its homeowners, but it is necessary in order to keep the community in great shape and preserve property values for the long term.

Fall is upon us, the holiday season is fast approaching, the days are getting cooler, and our winter residents & visitors are arriving. This is always an exciting time of year when we spend a little more time outside enjoying the weather and/or completing projects. This is also the time when our animals like to spend a little more time outside. Because of this, we were asked to provide some information on our response to barking dog complaints.

Marana Town Code 6-9-1 states that it is unlawful to have an animal which "frequently or for continuous duration howls, barks, meows, squawks or makes

other sounds, without provocation, if the sounds are clearly audible beyond the property line on which they are conducted and they disturb the public peace, quiet or comfort of the neighboring inhabitants". So, what does that mean? Basically, it is acceptable for a dog to bark momentarily when there is provocation, such as when a person or other animal approaches the property or other similar external stimuli causes the reaction. It is not acceptable for the dog to constantly bark without provocation when that barking creates a disturbance to others. Because excessive animal noise is classified as a disturbance, we can only take enforcement action when we have a listed victim whose peace was disturbed. Therefore, we cannot take enforcement action on anonymous complaints and request that you provide your information when filing a report.

To ensure a timely response, please report excessive animal noise by calling (520) 682-4032 when the excessive barking is occurring. Upon receipt of the complaint, an animal control officer will respond to investigate, attempt contact with all parties and take appropriate action based on available remedies.

If you have a dog that frequently barks this may be caused by boredom or loneliness; stress or anxiety; aggression; or from being overly stimulated by normal neighborhood noises. To reduce the barking we suggest trying one or more of the following: Reduce the time your dog spends isolated in the yard; bring the dog inside while you are away from home; increase your dog's daily exercise, mental and emotional stimulation with positive activity; utilize an ultrasonic device in the yard or a bark/training collar; install screening on your gate if the dog can easily see through it currently; train an alternate behavior; or consult with your dog's veterinarian.

From the Code Enforcement side, we also wanted to send out a few reminders to everyone...

- We will undoubtedly see an increase in on-street parking around the holidays as friends and family gather and we hope that everyone has a wonderful and safe season. To assist, please make sure that parking does not block any driveway access or sidewalk, obstruct traffic flow, or create a sight visibility issue. Also, please ensure that trees and bushes are trimmed to allow for unobstructed pedestrian access to the sidewalks and that all trimmings are properly disposed of.
- Together with World Care, we will be hosting an electronic recycling event on December 15, 2018, at the Crossroads at Silverbell District Park. This is a great opportunity to recycle your old electronic devices and small appliances. Please keep your eyes out for further details.


