September and October Recap:

Board Meeting at a Glance

The following are highlights from the regular meetings of the Board of Directors held September 20, 2022 and October 18, 2022 at the community center. Completed minutes will be posted to the website after they are approved at the next appropriate meeting. A copy of approved minutes may also be requested from the office. Recordings of all meetings will be retained for a period of 30 days following posting of approved minutes to the website.

Board Actions

At the September 20, 2022 meeting, the Board approved several Covenants Committee recommendations for fines and pool use suspensions for various unresolved violations; approved 2022 Procedure for Election; approved new plan submitted by A.F. Sterling for Sierra Pointe HOA; approved several amendments to the Design Guidelines as recommended by the ARC; appointed new member to the Landscape Committee; approved proposal from Brijer Resources to remove tree causing irrigation damage; approved proposal from AAA Landscape to fertilize the dying palm tree at the Windmill Park; approved proposal from AAA Landscape to perform an irrigation evaluation on portions of Twin Peaks Road and Coachline Boulevard; did not approve extending the Windmill Park pool season for 2022; approved purchase of two stainless steel posts for the splash pad features to replace current fiberglass posts that break prematurely; approved proposal from Oasis Pool Service to replace the Windmill Park

spa circulating pump; and approved lifting the cap of maximum occupancy for community center event rentals.

At the October 18, 2022 meeting, the Board approved several Covenants Committee recommendations for fines and pool use suspensions for various unresolved violations; approved homeowner appeal for their denied ARC application; appointed new member to the ARC; approved going out for bid for the landscape maintenance contract; approved sending all automatic chlorinators to the manufacturer for testing; approved renewal of contract with HOA Management Solutions; approved proposal from Oasis Pool Service to replace existing plumbing and three residential pool pumps for the Windmill Park pool with a commercial grade pump and new plumbing; approved proposal from Sovereign Electric to install additional lighting in the community center attic; approved proposal from Brijer Resources to remove two mature mesquite trees in between Sierra Pointe HOA and the community center; and approved proposal from AAA Landscape to install bubblers around four ash trees at Windmill Park.

Manager's Report

The community manager and assistant manager provided their reports to the board which included the status of all projects recently completed and/ or currently underway since the previous Board meeting.

It's that time again...the semi-annual assessments are due November 1st. Payments can be made either online, mailed to the office in the form of a check or money order, dropped off at the office during business hours, or placed in the drop box located just outside the office entrance anytime (check or money orders only). The grace period extends through November 15th before late fees are applied. Thank you to all who have already paid their assessment. Monthly payments break out to less than \$30 per month and many residents find this monthly rate to be more manageable than paying the lump assessments twice per year. Landscape Corner - November Do's & Don'ts

Thank you AAA Landscape for providing these helpful landscaping tips and tricks.



- Bermuda should be watered with one inch of water each week. Bermuda will become dormant as temperatures drop to below 50 degrees.
- Over seeding should have been done by now.
- Winter ryegrass should be moved to 1-1/2 to 2 inches. Keep watering until established and then water only about once a week.



- Yellowing of the winter lawn may occur when the cold weather sets in. An application of ammonium nitrate will bring back the dark green color.
- Cut back watering of all trees and shrubs, but continue to water deep. Don't over water or fungus will grow.
- ✓ Plant 3-5 gallon shrubs and 10-15 gallon trees.
- ✓ Clean dead branches out of trees and shrubs.
- ✓ Trim unwanted sprouts from the interior of your citrus trees. This makes it easier to harvest fruit.
- ✓ Keep the skirt of your citrus trees pruned and trimmed to about two or three feet from the ground. This permits a better air flow and minimizes chances of fungus.
- ✓ Plant in full sun: petunias, calendulas, dianthus and snapdragons
- ✓ Plant in part sun or shade: dianthus, geraniums, impatients, and primrose
- ✓ Keep spent rose blooms pruned.




- Plant bulbs in well-drained soil that is also high in compost or organic matter. Your bulbs should be planted with about two inches of sand beneath them. Cover with a coarse material such as peat moss or crushed wood products, such as bark. Plant Amaryllis, Anemone, Calla and Easter Lily, Dutch Crocus, Daffodil, Freesia, Gladiolus, Iris, and Ranunculus.
- Planting in clusters rather than in rows makes for a nice arrangement. Bulbs should be given a good soaking
- ✓ immediately after planting, and every seven to ten days after growth begins.
- ✓ Now is the time to plant seeds for beets, bok choy, broccoli, cabbage, carrots, cauliflower, celery, chard, collards, endive, kale, lettuce, mustard, onions, parsley, peas, radishes, rutabaga, spinach, and turnips.
- ✓ Transplants in November include asparagus, broccoli, brussel sprouts, cabbage, cauliflower, chard, and lettuce.
- ✓ When you plant any of the many varieties of leaf lettuce you can harvest and the plant will keep growing new leaves. You don't have to pick the whole head of lettuce.
 - ✓ Don't water the lawn when it's dark.
 - ✓ Do not fertilize frost-tender plants such as bottlebrush, bougainvillea, oleander and citrus.
 - ✓ Don't procrastinate about preparing for cold weather. Toward the end of November we can get frost, and your garden will be at risk if you don't cover tender plants, flowers and vegetables.
 - ✓ Don't ignore weeds. Either pull them later, or use pre-emergent now.




December Do's & Don'ts

PREPARE FOR FROSTS NOW.

If you don't care for your sensitive trees, bushes, flowers and vegetables before the first frost, it's probably too late, since the first frost will permanently damage them. It is not uncommon to have up to 20 frosty mornings in December. Be prepared to cover those frost-tender plants throughout December.

✓ Your over-seeded winter lawn should be established by now. If your winter lawn turns yellowish, fertilize. An application of Ironite will bring back the dark green color.




- ✓ Water every 5-7 days, or more often if you notice a drying-out of the soil. Light or sandy soils dry out faster.
- ✓ Wrap the trunks of young citrus and other cold-tender trees with cloth, cardboard or several layers of newspaper (no plastic) to protect them from frost. Leave them wrapped until the threat of frost has passed.



- ✓ Sweet oranges, navels, lemons, tangerines and tangelos may now be picked now but pick only as needed. As the season wears on, the fruits will continue to sweeten. Citrus fruit stores best on the tree.
- ✓ Frost-tolerant trees and shrubs may be planted this month. Dig holes three to five times the size of the root ball but not any deeper. Set the plant so the top of the root ball is ground level and then backfill.
- ✔ Remove dead branches and water sprouts.
- ✔ CHRISTMAS TREES When you purchase your tree, try to get a freshly cut tree. Feel the needles for dryness; the needles should be pliable. Cut an inch off the trunk, put it in a stand with a water reservoir and fill it daily. If you buy a living tree, don't bring it inside until about a week before Christmas and take it back outside right after the holiday. After the tree has been outside for a while and is again acclimated to the colder weather, you can plant it or donate it to a school or park.



- ✔ Plant seeds: beets, broccoli, cabbage, carrots, cauliflower, garlic bulbs, green onions, leeks, lettuce, parsley, peas, radishes, swiss chard, spinach and turnips.
 - ✓ Plant transplants: asparagus, broccoli, cabbage, cauliflower, lettuce (head & leaf)
 - ✓ Flowers can still be planted so choose your favorite annuals and perennials.
 - ✓ You can still plant bulbs. Plant them in well-drained soil that is also high in compost or organic matter. Your bulbs should be planted with about two inches of sand beneath them. Cover with a coarse material such as peat moss or crushed wood products, such as bark.
 - Chrysanthemums begin to die back after blooming. Cut back dead or dying foliage and add a bit of nitrogen fertilizer.
- Poinsettias will turn yellow if you water them with the foil sleeve still on because they will sit in the water. Take them to the sink, remove the foil sleeve, water until water comes out the bottom, let them drain for a few minutes and then put the foil sleeve back on.



- ✔ Don't fertilize trees or shrubs in December. Wait until Spring.
- ✔ Don't over water.
- Don't ignore pest problems.

Community Upgrade!

Continental Ranch boasts seven different playgrounds, one of which was recently replaced as recommended and budgeted by the Reserve Study. After reviewing multiple bids, a proposal from Tree Frogs Playground Company was approved to install the new playground, two benches and one trash can, which is located on West Sunset Mountain Drive, just off the freeway on Twin Peaks Road. The CRCA Board hopes residents will continue to enjoy this park for years to come!





Pool Decking Restoration

Over the upcoming winter months while both pools are closed, both the Windmill Park and Community Center pool decks are scheduled to be completely resurfaced. Periodic repairs and resealing are done every few years, but the time came due to provide a full restoration to the pool decks. Funds were proactively put aside into the Reserves over the years to budget for the project, which was awarded to Backyard Boulders. In general, existing decks will be demolished, additional deck drains installed to improve surface drainage of standing water, new Lace texture with acrylic color coat of Kool Deck paint applied, and replacement of



existing deck drains, tiles, skimmer and auto-fill lids is included. The Windmill Park pool deck resurface is scheduled to begin in November and the Community Center pool deck will be resurfaced in January.



Management's Message

Another successful Annual Meeting in the books and we're so appreciative of everyone who helped participate in this year's election. Everything leading up to the big night would be for nothing if enough ballots aren't received so go ahead and give yourself a big pat on the back if you voted!

All turf other than the Windmill Park baseball outfield was recently overseeded for ryegrass this winter. AAA Landscape recommends waiting until after November 11th so please be respectful and avoid walking on the grass until then.

As many are aware, the splash pad had been shut down from mid-September until the end of the pool season due to a broken water feature post. This post and another were made of PVC, and it wasn't the first to break prematurely since the splash pad was installed seven years ago. A 'likefor-like' replacement was considered in order to reopen the splash pad as quickly as possible, but the lead time for another PVC post was still lengthy at 3-4 weeks. At the September 20th Board Meeting, the Board voted to upgrade and replace the two PVC posts with stainless steel posts that carry a 25-year warranty versus only 1-year for PVC. The new posts are expected to arrive and be installed this November, and we hope this won't be an issue for residents again.
